

What's New in New Ministries By Rev. Lydia Sohn

On Sunday morning, I preached about the gospel lectionary passage, John 6:1-21, where Jesus feeds 5000 people with 5 loaves of bread and 2 fish. It is one of my favorite stories and it really gets to the heart of who our God is, who operates at a completely different level than us.

We calculate, we budget, we hoard so we can have more and others can have less. But in God's economic system, when I thrive, you thrive and when you thrive, I thrive. God's economy is abundance-based instead of scarcity-based, meaning that there is always enough, more than enough, for all of us.

As such, we no longer have to compete with one another to be the smartest person in the room, the greatest writer on a subject, the most talented employee, you get the idea. There is more than enough space for all of us to thrive in our own unique ways and even, in collaboration with one another.

With this thinking in mind, a couple of the pastors in our area and myself have been talking about a collaborative ministry that reaches out to the unchurched population. We all have strong youth groups and young family programs. It's the younger unchurched generation that we are all having difficulty with. What would it look like if we worked together, we wondered. Perhaps we would feel less isolated, less burdened, less cynical? Perhaps we could create something even more amazing and creative with three heads put together than just one.

There is a fear when we talk about something like this. A fear such as, but...where will the money go? Which of the three churches will newcomers end up going to? The ultimate question is...but how will it draw people to our single congregation?

And I will return to the gospel passage from this past Sunday, that teaches us that we do not need to be afraid that we will not have enough or that we will not succeed if the success is shared. If I thrive, you thrive and if you thrive, I thrive. We are all interconnected and we as United Methodists know this more than any other denomination as we are a connectional denomination where the greater success of the institution really does benefit all of the local churches and visa-versa.

That said, I still don't know what the new ministry will look like but exciting conversations abound at the moment and like always, I will keep you in the loop.


